**2012 Kuskokwim River Salmon Fishery News Release 6  
Kuskokwim River Subsistence Salmon Fishing Restrictions  
Emergency Order 5**

This is an announcement from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game at Bethel for subsistence salmon fishermen in the Kuskokwim River Drainage.

Effective 12:00 a.m., Sunday, June 17, 2012 until 11:59 p.m., Thursday, June 21, 2012 subsistence Chinook salmon fishing with hook and line gear is closed and subsistence fishing is restricted to the use of gillnets with 4-inch or less mesh not exceeding 60-feet in length in the Lower Section of Subdistrict 1-B (Rolling Closure Section 1). This extends the Rolling Closure in Section 1 as announced in News Release 3 for five additional days.

Lower Section of Subdistrict 1-B (Rolling Closure Section 1) is defined as, that portion of the Kuskokwim River and its tributaries upstream from a line from Apokak Slough to the southernmost tip of Eek Island to Popokamiut to a line between ADF&G regulatory markers located between the Kialik and Johnson Rivers. This area is also known as the Lower Section of commercial fishing Subdistrict 1-B. Excluded waters are non-salmon spawning tributaries: those portions of Kinak, Kialik, and Tagayarak rivers more than 100 yards upstream from the mouth of these rivers, are open with any mesh size gillnet and are not affected by these closures.

The current Bethel Test Fishery (BTF) Catch Per Unit Effort (CPUE) indicates that there are not enough Chinook salmon to meet the 2012 Chinook salmon Management Objective (Management Objective) that was agreed upon by the Department, the Federal Inseason Manager, and was

supported by the Kuskokwim River Salmon Management Working Group (Working Group). During the Friday, June 15, Working Group meeting the Department and the Federal Inseason Manager presented a recommendation to extend the 7-day rolling closure along the Kuskokwim River for 5 additional days in an effort to conserve Chinook salmon. The Working Group voted to not support the recommendation.

If the BTF CPUE indicates that the Management Objective is likely to be met, subsistence restrictions may be reduced. However, if the BTF CPUE continues to indicate that the Management Objective will not be met; further management actions will be warranted.

The assessment of chum and sockeye salmon at the BTF indicates that abundance of these species are low at this point, but their abundance is expected to increase over the next two weeks based on historic run timing. The Department and Federal Inseason Manager intend to allow opportunity to harvest these species when their abundance is adequate to reduce impacts on Chinook salmon abundance.

The subsistence salmon fishing closures in the Kuskokwim River Drainage in the Upper Section of Subdistrict 1-B to Tuluksak (Rolling Closure Section 2) as announced in News Release 4 and in the Kuskokwim River Drainage from Tuluksak to Chuathbaluk (Rolling Closure Section 3) as announced in News Release 5 remain in effect. Subsistence fishing remains open 7 days per week above the regulatory markers located at Chuathbaluk.


