

Stock assessment of sockeye salmon from the Buskin River, Kodiak, Alaska, 2001

Abstract: A weir was operated on the Buskin River on Kodiak Island, Alaska, from May 20 – July 31, 2001 to enumerate sockeye salmon *Oncorhynchus nerka*. We counted 20,544 sockeye salmon, the largest recorded escapement, into the Buskin River. The midpoint of the run occurred on June 10. Most sockeye salmon in the escapement were ages 1.3 or 2.3. The subsistence harvest was 8,251 sockeye salmon, most of which were ages 1.3 or 2.3.
