Permit Required for Federal Subsistence Fyke Net (Fish Weir) Fishery

Permits for the new Federal subsistence fyke net (fish weir) fishery, approved in December 2007 by the Federal Subsistence Board, are now available from the Lake Clark National Park and Preserve Headquarters in Port Alsworth.

The waters open to fishing with a fyke net and lead (fish weir) are those tributaries of Lake Clark and Sixmile Lake within the exterior boundaries of Lake Clark National Park and Preserve.

This fishery is open to Federally qualified subsistence users living in Lake Clark National Park and Preserve and resident zone communities of Iliamna, Lime Village, Newhalen, Nondalton, Pedro Bay and Port Alsworth and those individuals who hold a 36 CFR 13.44 permit. Permit holders must be present when the fyke net is actively fishing. All materials used to construct the fyke net and lead (fish weir) must be made of wood and must be removed from the water when no longer in use.
