PROGRAM GOAL	Restoration and enhancement of upland, riparian, wetland, and aquatic habitats on private, Native Corporate and municipal lands only.	Conservation of coastal ecosystems through habitat assessment, restoration, protection, and acquisition.	Restoration of aquatic habitat fragmented by non-natural barriers to fish passage. Program allows partnerships on all land ownerships.
PROJECT EXAMPLES	Riparian and fish habitat enhancement and restoration, fish passage enhancement, wetland reconnection.	Conservation planning, habitat assessment and mapping, conservation easements, habitat restoration, habitat focused outreach and education.	Culvert and dam removal, culvert replacement or enhancement, fish passage design, inventory and assessment.
WHO CAN APPLY	Private landowners, local and tribal governments, and non-profits working on behalf of landowners.	State, local, federal, and tribal governments, landowners, non-profits, and universities.	Federal, State, local, and tribal governments, and non-profits on behalf of landowners.
