Program goal	Restore or enhance priority upland, riparian, wetland, or aquatic habitats on private lands	Remove artificial barriers to passage of migratory or resident fish	Conserve and restore coastal habitat	Build private/public partnerships through locally-driven efforts that benefit fish habitat via protection, restoration, assessment or education
Project examples	Streambank and in-stream habitat enhancement and restoration; fish passage enhancement; schoolyard habitats	Culvert and dam removal; culvert upgrades; fish passage design, inventory, assessment	Habitat assessment and mapping; outreach in support of habitat conservation projects	Fish habitat assessments; habitat restoration; outreach and education with on-the ground restoration component
Who can apply	Private landowners, local and tribal governments, non-profits working on behalf of landowners	Local, state, and tribal governments; non-profits, and private landowners	Local, state, and tribal governments, landowners, non-profits, and universities	Local, state, federal, and tribal governments, non-profits, municipalities, and universities proposing projects in recognized partnership areas
Does NOT fund	These programs do not fund political advocacy, mitigation, permit compliance or acquisition of real property (e.g., conservation easements)
